Color these robot parts, cut them out, and put together your own amazing paper robot.










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Tell a Robot Story Game



Discover what robots can do with my Tell a Robot Story game.

Colored card stock or construction paper in 3 colors (optional)


Glue (optional)

Set Up:

Special Skills




How to Play:
